Culture

— **Václav Špála Gallery and Josef Sudek Studio:** PPF Art manages these two famous galleries in Prague year-round and organises their exhibition programmes.

— **PPF Group's Photography Collection:** probably the largest private collection of Czech and Slovak photography, it currently has 2,044 photographs by 192 photographers. The core of the collection comprises works by the world-renowned Czech photographer Josef Sudek.

— **PPF Group's Fine Art Collection:** the collection has 333 artworks, primarily paintings and sculptures, by Czech artists from the last two centuries, including A. Mucha, J. Schikaneder, M. Medek, I. Ouhel, T. Čiśařovský, P. Nikl and others.

— **Jára Cimrman Theatre, Summer Shakespeare Festival and Prague Art Week:** long-term financial support.

— **Musical instruments for the Czech Philharmonic:** the loan of six string instruments with a total value around CZK 20 million.

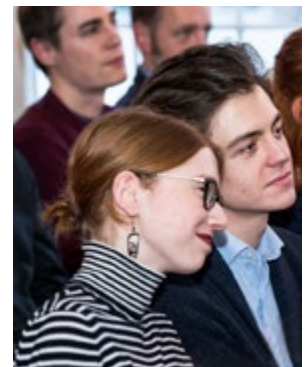

The Foundation also supports students from low-income families. Each year the Foundation allocates approximately **CZK 40 million** for scholarships.

were included in the Foundation's Universities Project in the 2018/2019 academic year. The Foundation divided **CZK 10 million** between them to cover their school fees and living expenses, primarily at universities abroad.
